Crafts assembled primarily from Commercially made parts or Commercial Molds, Services such as Massage, Nutrition Consulting, Commercially-Manufactured Shirts, Mugs, Etc., Live Animals.

HELP US KEEP OUR FARMERS MARKET HOMETGROWN, HOMEMADE & HANDMADE

Please read through these guidelines, and if you have any questions call our office to discuss. We are responsible for verifying that all products meet the Dublin Farmers Market standards. Any vendor who brings items to the market that don't match our market standards will politely be asked to remove the items from the vendor sales space.

Arts & crafts applicants must submit at least two photographs of their work. If more than one type of craft is to be sold, please include photos of each kind of craft. Acceptance of new arts & craft vendors will be based on these guidelines.

Vendor space is limited. Vendors may be put on the waiting list.

If your product is not eligible for our farmers' market, be sure to contact the Downtown Dublin Office about other opportunities for selling your products at other events.

LOCATION AND HOURS OF OPERATION

The Farmers Market is located at the Market on Madison at 314 W. Madison Street, Dublin, Georgia. In 2026, it will operate every Saturday from April 4 through October 10 and be open from 7:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

COST TO PARTICIPATE

In an effort to help offset operational costs of running the Farmers Market, we charge a participation fee.

Full Season: \$200 (pay annually or in installments) Half Season: \$100 All other vendors: \$15 per Saturday.

BENEFITS INCLUDE:

Full Season – 28 weeks

- Regular weekly space
- Included in weekly ad in Courier Herald
- Window decal for vehicle
- Discounted booth (50%) at Chili Cook-Off, October 17, 2026
- Invitation to Market Kick off

Half Season – 14 weeks

- Best remaining space at Farmers Market after full season selection
- Included in weekly ad in Courier Herald
- Window decal for vehicle
- Discounted booth (50%) at Chili Cook-Off, October 17, 2026

For all other vendors, (less than 14 weeks), space will be based on availability and cost \$15 per Saturday.

VENDOR'S EXHIBIT SPACE

If you are not a regular vendor, you must call the Downtown Dublin Office at 478-272-2560 by Wednesday to request a booth for the Saturday market and let us know the products you are selling. If it's your first time selling, you will need to review our guidelines and complete an application.

Vendor spaces will be assigned by Friday afternoon for all market vendors who have reserved a booth. When you come to the market on Saturday, the Market Manager will direct you to your space.

SET-UP, CLEAN-UP AND BREAKDOWN

Set-up begins at 6:30 a.m. and should be completed by 7:30 a.m. Vendors are responsible for providing, setting up, and removing their equipment and supplies, including tables, chairs, signs, products, scales, etc. Breakdown should begin at 12:30 p.m. Vendors are responsible for removing all garbage and waste from their area. Please place your trash in the commercial container provided on the property. **On-site trash receptacles should be used by customers only.**

SIGNS

Good signs help your sales! For best results, please label and price all your goods. Signs may not be hung using nails, tacks, screws, etc. All signs must remain within the vendor's exhibit area and must not block any traffic or pedestrian walkways or other vendor's displays or views.

ATTENDANCE & CONDUCT

The Farmers Market will operate rain or shine unless the weather becomes a public hazard. It is very important for you to attend the market if you have a booth reserved. Why? We advertise to the public that you will be selling your goods at the Farmers Market. If you fail to show up, it is not a positive reflection on the overall Farmers Market's image. Please help us present in the very best way possible. Vendors are expected to behave in a courteous and respectful manner toward customers, other vendors, market staff and volunteers. Each vendor will sign a code of conduct in order to participate at the Dublin Farmers Market.

TAXES, LAWS, ETC.

Vendors are responsible for collecting and remitting their own sales tax. Vendors are responsible for all permits required by the state of Georgia and **must submit copies with their application.** Vendors must comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the United States, State of Georgia, Laurens County and City of Dublin, Georgia. All rules are subject to being revised periodically.

The Dublin Farmers Market is an on-going project of the Dublin Downtown Development Authority and is managed by Downtown Dublin.
